There is no doubt in my mind that the most important affirmation we must hold in our hearts as we begin this new year is that *"light has shone in the darkness – and the darkness has not overcome it."*

Can anyone doubt that there is and remains much darkness in the world? Is anything really more obvious than this? Less obvious to many is the truth of Emmanuel – *God-with-us* – who is always coming to the world to heal, encourage, and offer hope of the world's redemption from sin, suffering and death. This is the Good News that the world is desperate to hear! How much are we – Christ's brothers and sisters – needed to shed the light of Christ's love within a dark world.

We have read the following affirmation, a favorite of mine, in worship. I share it with you again for your quiet reflection.

*I make an act of faith toward all humankind,  
where doubts would linger and suspicions brood.  
I make an act of joy toward all sad hearts,  
where laughter pales and tears abound.  
I make an act of strength toward feeble things,  
where life grows dim and death draws near.  
I make an act of trust toward all of life,  
where fears preside and distrusts keep watch.  
I make an act of love toward friend and foe,  
where trust is weak and hate burns bright.  
I make a deed to God of all my days –  
and look out on life with quiet eyes.*

The light has shone – and the darkness has not overcome it.  
It is our time to share the light with the world.

Have you ever been homeless? Or perhaps know someone who has been? A roof over our heads is one luxury that most of us don't ever think about. There are families in our communities that are in need. And our Fisk congregation has been a great partner with Family Promise (formerly named Metrowest Interfaith Hospitality Network -MIHN) over the past years, including hosting the families during the summer.

The fourth annual Walk-a-thon is coming up on the second Saturday in February. This is the biggest fundraiser of the year for Family Promise, lots of fun, refreshments and a few donated prize drawings. Each person in our congregation has the opportunity and ability to participate. Your contributions will go towards supporting housing, job placement, childcare, tutoring, health services, clothing and transportation for Homeless Families.

Early response Training (the UMCOR Basic ERT course) is scheduled to take place **from 8:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. on January at Carter Memorial UMC, 800 Highland Avenue - Needham, MA 02494.** There is a \$25.00 registration fee to cover the cost of Basic ERT manual, ERT T-shirt, morning refreshments, and lunch. The Rev. John Blackadar and David Stackpole, UMCOR certified trainers, will conduct this UMCOR training. 2012 brought the Sandy Hurricane to several of our conferences to the South of us and they are calling us to send ERTs to help. We need more ERTs trained. The New England Conference currently has about 1150 ERTs with UMCOR badges. Emphasis will be put on Mud-out, debris and wallboard removal.
