Pastor's Note

The Season of Lent begins with Ash Wednesday which is March 1st. This season is our intentional annual pilgrimage in the footsteps of Jesus Christ. As we travel, it is important for each of us to reflect on our mortality and the challenges we face as humans. Though our human conditions are sometimes different, sometimes challenging, there is always a reward at the end of this journey. The good thing is we do not walk alone. Hence, during this Season of Lent, we can walk together from Ash Wednesday until Easter Sunday.

We can start with our Ash Wednesday service at 7pm as each person is invited to moments of prayer, fasting, studies, fellowship with soup and bread during Lent and a reenactment of the Last Supper on Holy Thursday, April 13th. Also, during this time we are invited to reflect on our relationship with God and all of God's creation.

As we reflect, let us pray without ceasing, hear the cries, feel with empathy, and see the silent tears of others. But most of all let us not just walk these forty days of repentance and renewal but all days ahead.
May we be forgiving as we forgive others!

Family Promise Metrowest 8th Annual Walk to End Homelessness!

I am writing to encourage you to join our team to walk to end homelessness on **April 8th from 8:00 to 10:30 a.m. at the Natick Community Senior Center**. The walk is about 3 miles (to the high school and back), and your participation would mean a lot to me and to the families you will be helping.

Did you know?

- The average age of a homeless child served by Family Promise Metrowest is 6 years old.
- Most homeless shelters separate fathers and boys over 12 from the rest of their family. Family Promise Metrowest keeps families together.
- 25% of homeless people are children under the age of 18.
- Children experiencing homelessness are sick 4 times more often than other children.
- A family of 4 grossing more than \$2,114 per month is NOT eligible for state shelter assistance.

Please come to walk and join in the fun. There will be a DJ, drinks and food, games and prizes and other fun activities.

Nurturing a Grateful Heart

As most of you who have raised or taught children know, at young ages they are egocentric. It is just the way they are. As Christians and just good adult role models, we work to build the habit of gratefulness. Children often focus on the gift without saying a thank you or recognizing the giver.

1. Talk to your child about being grateful.
2. Give them examples of how to acknowledge a giver.
3. Be a good role model.
4. Set expectations.
5. Have a system of cueing. Younger children may need a verbal cue.
6. As your child grows, a look from a parent or teacher will do. (I well recall the look from my parents from across the room.)

Congratulate yourself for letting your child know that being grateful is a good trait and makes others, and the receiver as well, feel good.

40 Days of Lent: Find
your own spiritual path

During **Ash Wednesday services** on the first day of Lent, many United Methodist pastors will invite their congregations "to observe a holy Lent: by self-examination and repentance; by prayer, fasting, and self-denial; and by reading and meditating on God's Holy Word" (from the **United Methodist Book of Worship**). While you may be aware of this season leading up to Easter, you may wonder how you might "observe a holy Lent." There is no one prescribed way. Instead, we are each encouraged to find our own method of confronting our sinfulness, remembering our mortality, and giving thanks for the gift of salvation we receive through the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

Fasting: One of the more common practices is to give something up for Lent. Some abstain from chocolate, social media, shopping, or something else through the season. We fast to reorient ourselves away from the distraction of those things, and back toward God.

Bible reading: Many do not know where to begin when reading the Bible. The Upper Room Daily Devotional Guide and Alive Now will help guide you in this pursuit. Each day they provide a scripture passage and wonderfully thought-provoking and spirit-enriching material to read and think about.

Prayer: In the busyness of our everyday lives, prayer can sometimes get squeezed out. Lent is a wonderful time to intentionally work toward finding more time in your life for prayer. You can experiment with different ways to pray during the season, or really delve into a new-to-you way of praying.

Service: Another way to observe a holy Lent is to take on a new way of serving. Throughout the forty days of the season you can adopt a new habit of volunteering in the community, making special financial gifts to service organizations, singing in the choir, or participating in a small group.

Rest: An important practice with which many of us struggle is the spiritual discipline of rest or Sabbath. We don't have to rest on Saturday, the traditional Sabbath day, or even Sunday. You can instead find moments during an ordinary day to be still in God's presence. You might choose to spend a few minutes during lunch with a desktop meditation, listen to sermons on your commute, or read a poem that feeds your spirit.
