December 2014 Reflections from Pastor Xia

Dear family and friends of Fisk Memorial UMC;

Holiday greetings from your church home! As I am writing this, I realize that Advent is upon us, and another Thanksgiving is just around the corner. I am now sitting in my study, doing my morning routine—reading the Bible and meditating on the Scripture verses of the day. The passage Luke 17:11-19 just came to my mind. Jesus healed ten lepers. In my mind's eye, I can see the lepers walking, hobbling, scooting; joy filled their souls. Their faith in the faithful God saved them and made them clean. At the time, there was one, one out of ten, stopped, "came back, praising God in a loud voice. He threw himself at Jesus' feet, and thanked him."

To that one Jesus said "Your faith has made you well." The Greek word used here for "well" also means "whole." While the other nine were "healed," this one was made complete and whole. The same Greek word is used in the story of Zaccheaus for "to be saved." By having faith in Jesus Christ, all of them were healed of their leprosy. By returning to give thanks to Jesus, the one was made whole.

When thankfulness becomes an integral part of our life, our attitude toward life changes. We become more positive, loving, and humble. Now, I admit, it is difficult to thank God when the alarm goes off at 5:00am on a cold winter morning and I know I have to get up. It is difficult to thank God when your carefully planned weekend of relaxation dissolves into a mass of catch up chores. It is difficult to thank God when you, or someone you love, is hurting, either physically or spiritually. Yet, without thankfulness in our lives, we have no way to see positive things, joy, peace, love and hope.

Thankfulness. What an amazing word. In our prayer, we always begin with the word, "God, we thank you for ..."

Thankfulness is more than an act of good manners. It is a major component of our lives. So, what are you thankful for today? Whom do you give thanks to?

I ask you, this Thanksgiving, and throughout the Advent season, as you gather around your table, full of so many good things, to remember and to prepare– to remember not only the good gifts that God has granted you throughout this year, but to remember the God who has been with us through good times and bad, who has been constant in His faithfulness and mercy, who has given us the gift of clean water, fresh food, loving family and friends. And before we pass the turkey and pumpkin pie, stop for a moment and remember from whose hand we receive such things. And give Him thanks.

Meister Eckhart once said, "If the only prayer you ever say in your whole life is 'thank you,' that would suffice." I am thankful for YOU. With a prayerful and thankful heart, let us prepare the way for peace and expect a brand new church year.

Finance Update – December 2014

We must report that we continue to find ourselves behind in Pledge support as of October 31st. The faithful support of you the congregation continues to be a blessing, but our ministries are in need.

Our position is:

Support and other income	\$ 194,678
Expenses of ministry	\$ 197,187
Deficit (10 months)	\$ (2,509)

As a result we are spending wisely, and carefully managing our resources:

- Your financial support remains 10% below Budget, through October,
- We are spending less than our budgeted expenses to compensate, but expenses continue, and we may not be able to fully fund our valued ministries at our current rates,
- We continue to pray for improvements in our financial position.

Please do all you can to get your pledges in for 2014 so we can end on a positive note. If you have not given in the past, we would urge you to consider supporting our ministries. If you are current, we thank you, and ask that you consider increasing your support this year. We are currently "borrowing" from our longterm congregational assets in order to fund all of our planned ministries this year. We need your prayerful assistance.

The ministries of Fisk touch so many people in so many ways. As we enter the advent holiday period, we must prayerfully and purposefully work to grow our church spiritually...and our finances will follow.
