### 2015 Poinsettia Orders

The plant's association with Christmas began in 16<sup>th</sup> century Mexico, where legend tells of a girl commonly called Pepita or Maria, who was too poor to provide a gift for the celebration of Jesus' birthday and was inspired by an angel to gather weeds from the roadside and place them in front of the church altar. Crimson blossoms sprouted from the weeds and became beautiful poinsettias. From the 17<sup>th</sup> century, Franciscan friars in Mexico included the plants in their Christmas celebrations. The star-shaped leaf pattern is said to symbolize the Star of Bethlehem, and the red color represents the blood sacrifice through the crucifixion of Jesus.

December 12 is National Poinsettia Day! December 12 is A Night In Bethlehem at Fisk! December 14 is the last day to place your order for a poinsettia in honor or in memory of someone and help beautify our sanctuary on December 22 and Christmas Eve.

It is that time of year again! Each poinsettia is \$10.
