Pastor's Note

As we enter the Season of Advent and anticipate the birth of the Christ Child, believe that God already made it plain and simple how to live and what to do. That is, do what is fair and just to your neighbor, be compassionate and most of all, embody real love.

Micah was a prophet who had strong opinions all the time. For example, he would say that a person who does no harm is fulfilled, and he was intolerant of persons who acted unfairly, took advantage of, who were selfcentered and who though it was all about him or her. And though his words sometimes sounded extreme, he reminds us to live each day with justice as our rod and staff.

This time of the year is filled with events, gift-giving and sometimes sharing from the heart but there is always that hidden message of, "Fear not". 2017 Poinsettia Orders

The plant's association with Christmas began in 16th century Mexico, where legend tells of a girl commonly called Pepita or Maria, who was too poor to provide a gift for the celebration of Jesus' birthday and was inspired by an angel to gather weeds from the roadside and place them in front of the church altar. Crimson blossoms sprouted from the weeds and became beautiful poinsettias. From the 17th century, Franciscan friars in Mexico included the plants in their Christmas celebrations. The star-shaped leaf pattern is said to symbolize the Star of Bethlehem, and the red color represents the blood sacrifice through the crucifixion of Jesus.

UMCOR – United Methodist Committee on Relief This is the major arm of mission work for our denomination.

Justice For Our Neighbors

JFON—Justice for our Neighbors is a national organization of Immigration Ministry connected to the United Methodist Church to help assimilate immigrants into their new country. One of the services offered is legal help to work through the legal process and the paperwork. Sixteen people from Fisk attended the 3rd Annual Dinner to support JFON in November. The evening consisted of an international dinner, Silent Auction and two testimonies from young people and their struggle to remain in the United States. (Excepts from the second speaker)

The evening's final speaker was Elizabeth, who also spoke at last year's event. She is one of the 800,000 young people seeking to regularize their status through the DREAM Act, i.e. Development, Relief, and Education for Alien Minors.

Since she was last at JFON, Elizabeth, who came to the U.S. as a 5-year-old, has graduated from nursing school, passed her licensing exams, and gotten a job. But she is not as hopeful as she was just a year ago. "Today, I don't come here with a hopeful heart. I come with a heart in mourning for a future that I had planned," she said, adding that the uncertainty has tinged all of her accomplishments.

For some covered by the DREAM Act their status could end as early as March 2018; others have a year and some, like Elizabeth, two years. "People keep telling me have faith, but it's hard," she said. "It's been 23 years waiting for something to happen. So today I come here to tell you a little bit about what's going on in my heart and to ask you to speak up, to have a voice and to use it, because I can't anymore."

"We need you to speak up, to fight for us, to love us, to hug us, to give us words of encouragement and to treat us like human beings," she said. "We need you to be our strength right now and our voices."

The Mission Committee voted to support this important work with a gift of \$150.00 from our portion of the Rental Income from the parsonage. How can we help? Letters and calls to government officials and/or write a check to Fisk marked JFON.

Finance Update

We must report that we continue to find ourselves behind in Pledge support by 10% as of October 31st. The faithful support of you the congregation continues to be a blessing, but our ministries are in need. Our position is:

Support and other income	\$ 155,000
Expenses of ministry	\$ 162,000
Deficit (10 months)	\$ (7,000)

As a result we are spending wisely, and carefully managing our resources:

- Our giving support remains 7% below Budget through October,
- We are spending less than our budgeted expenses to compensate, but expenses continue, and we may not be able to fully fund our valued ministries at our current rates. We have only paid 7 months of mission shares.
- We continue to pray for improvements in our financial position.

We urge you to do all you can to get your pledged commitments in for 2017 in order to avoid a deficit. Every person's effort matters. If you have not given in the past, we would urge you to consider supporting our ministries. If you are current, we thank you, and ask that you consider increasing your support this year. We may be forced to utilize our reserve "savings" in order to fund all of our planned ministries this year. We need your prayerful assistance.

The ministries of Fisk touch so many people in so many ways. As we enter this joyful advent season, we must prayerfully and purposefully work to grow our church...and our finances will follow.
