
### Pastor's Message


As we start to take the journey through Advent to Christmas, can we open our hearts, minds and hands wider?

## Financial Update:

In this blessed season of Advent, many worthy charities are appealing for our support. As you reflect and discern, do not overlook the many, many ways that your giving supports the ministries of your Church. Fisk's ministries also need your help:

- Our pledge giving remains 8% below planned commitments as of October, which is more severe than last year. December's generosity is critical for our ministries.
  - We are carefully managing our spending, currently 5% less than budget, currently saving \$10,000 year to date, but required spending must still be funded, including Mission Shares,
- Our deficit as of October is higher than our Planned Annual Deficit, and we are using cash reserves to fund our obligations.

The successes of our ministries are funded almost entirely by our stewardship support. Those many ministries touch so many people in so many ways... in our congregation, our community, and our world.
