Reflections from Pastor Mark

Snow outside the window falling

Cataract over my eyeseverything milky white

Blurred in this case wonderful.

Yeah, winter has finally arrived – just in time for the AFC championship game (which the Patriots won!) – and New England looks like New England again. I can't say that I enjoy driving in the snow – or that my back enjoys my shoveling sidewalks! – but the white stuff certainly is beautiful to look at.

Almost ironically, we are just now planning for Lent as the first real snow of winter has arrived. *Lent* – the 40 days (minus Sundays) between Ash Wednesday and Easter – actually means *springtime* in an old Teutonic language. *For Christians, Lent is springtime of the spirit*.

That idea probably takes some getting used to as we may habitually think of Lent as a sad time of penitence, self-reflection and fasting – all leading up to the crucifixion of Christ. That is of course true: Lent

is a serious matter, one of the best spiritual opportunities provided each year of our lives for growing and maturing in Christ. Lent is the season for self-discipline. . . and that sounds heavy indeed.

We might want to think of it this way, instead: Remember what it is like to open the windows of your house on the first beautiful day of spring: Can you smell the clean air? Smell the earth reawakened after winter? See the crocuses pushing their

heads toward the sun? Feel the sun on your face and the breeze now gentle and warm? Wonderful, isn't it? As spring is a celebration of life, so, too, is Lent: A celebration of new life, life released from sin and pain and death, accomplished (we learn after our 40 days in the wilderness) in the astonishing Resurrection of Christ Jesus our Lord!

Lent 2012 begins on Ash Wednesday, February 22. We begin our journey together with a *Service of Ashes at 7:00 pm*. On Sunday mornings I will teach an *adult class* dedicated to the spirituality of our Lenten Journey. And I am especially excited to be a leader in a one-day *Lenten Retreat on Saturday, March 3*, to be held at the church. I hope you'll participate.

I am looking forward to Lent with real excitement. I've always loved the season, especially, I suppose because I know what it is leading up to! May God grant you excitement, anticipation and joy as we look forward to our Lenten journey together. Peace and joy,

Finance Update - February 2012

We were blessed in 2011 with a prayerful and generous response to our 2011 financial needs, and we thank you. Your increased support in December reduced our large projected deficit to only \$1,124. However, after carefully utilizing our cash savings from prior years to maintain the vital ministries our church, we were forced into the very undesirable position of not fully paying our New England Conference Mission shares, the support which all churches provide to the Conference. We made that decision prayerfully and carefully, and reserved the possibility of paying those mission obligations in July of 2012 if our financial position has improved.

In 2012, we face significant financial challenges as a congregation. The initial deficit gap was significant, but we have worked together with the Trustees to utilize the full resources of the congregation. We have reduced some expenses by asking the Trustees to assume the facility maintenance and other costs in 2012, and level funded or reduced other expenses. This cooperation was essential and significant, and we have reduced the Budget deficit to \$3,900 for the year. This deficit is due to our continuing trends in the last few years of loss of membership, absence of meaningful growth, a reduced pledge base, and the critical need for continued funding of our essential ministries and support. The Administrative Board has met, reviewed our recommendations, and has made important decisions on our 2012 Budget Plan. The final Budget will be available in the Church office, and published in summary next month here in the Messenger.

The ministries of Fisk touch so many people in so many ways. Those ministries, as always, depend upon the financial support of each and every one of us. As a congregation, we have responded in the past, and with prayer, cooperation, intentional dedication to growing our church, and HIS grace, we will respond and succeed in 2012.



The Story







In about 610 A.D. a very creative Alpine Monk decided to make use of the pieces of dough left over from baking bread. The Monk formed them into thin strips folded into a looped twist to represent the folded arms of children in prayer. This yummy treat was given to the children as they learned their prayers. They began calling the treat "Pretiola", which is Latin for "little reward". Soon it was known the world over as a pretzel. The secret of making great pretzels is not only in the baking but also in the shaping. We, like pretzels, are made from the best ingredients, by the best hands available, the hands of our loving God!. Have you ever seen a broken pretzel, or one that's lost its shape? We too, can lose our shape when we don't pray always to keep our spirituality intact. Even in the midst of our greatest trials, we must remember, as did Job, to call on the Lord. The simple shape of the pretzel, arms folded in prayer, reminds us to pray each day. Our "Pretiola" or "little rewards" are the blessings we receive. Every time you see a pretzel, remember prayer. Check to see if your arms are often folded in prayer and have not lost their shape. If you would like to bake pretzels for coffee hour, there are recipes in the literature rack outside of the nursery!
