After I come back, I will be sharing this spiritual journey with all of you ... probably you will see a different person, fully re-energized, with life deeply touched by the Holy Spirit. Please pray for your pastor and other pastors who are going on the journey together.

Together let us prepare our hearts, and strengthen our relationship and covenant with God in the season of Lent. May God's peace and blessings be with you each and every day!

Prayer Support for Pastor Xia



"Growing Our Faithful Community" and "Acts 29"

Fisk Friends, I am very pleased to have begun my service to Fisk as the Administrative Board Chair. The Administrative Board met January 14th and had a very fruitful discussion about the theme for Fisk in 2016 and what we as a congregation want to put in and get out of our shared experiences as a Christian community at Fisk.

As we see on each Sunday's bulletin, Fisk has a marvelous mission statement.

Fisk Church is a faithful community. <u>Drawing</u> others to Christ <u>Growing</u> our faith and trust in God <u>Sharing</u> God's light through prayer and witness <u>Serving</u> others through mission and outreach

As Pastor Xia mentioned in her sermon on January 24, 2016, the theme for Fisk this year is "Growing our Faithful Community." This is a reminder that Fisk is a community that shares an intimate faith in God, fellowship and friendship. We share our burdens and celebrations as well. Fisk is also a community that welcomes everyone, visitors, new members and those (like me) who have been around for many years.

The Bible is full of inspiring stories of active fellowship, worship and evangelism. The Book of Acts has many of these stories. Some passages for reflection are Acts 1: 1-10, Acts 2: 1-4, Acts 2: 42-47, and Acts 8: 4-8.

One could ask where Fisk can be found in these stories. Have you looked in the book of Acts, chapter 29 verses 1 through 4? Look it up. If you have trouble finding that passage it's OK. It's up to Fisk and Christians around the world to provide the 29th chapter of Acts.

At our January 14 meeting, the Administrative Board discussed the goals for 2016 in the context of our mission statement, our theme "Growing our Faithful Community" and the idea of "Acts 29." As always

I was encouraged by the insightful discussion, innovative ideas and deep commitment and concern for Fisk as a community of faith.

The "Acts 29 Challenge" set before the board can be paraphrased as planning all of 2016 with our theme in mind and all details planned within the context of the big picture at Fisk. At the time I write this letter, the various committees at Fisk are planning 2016 in this light and will bring the plans to the Council on Ministries to see how the plans fit the big picture. Throughout the year the Council on Ministries and Administrative Board will review our progress and forward looking plans as they relate to "Growing our Faithful Community."

I look forward to 2016 and all the experiences that we as a Faithful Community will share. I am pleased that I can serve as Administrative Board Chair and welcome any feedback or ideas on how Fisk can "Grow our Faithful Community."

The finance committee has closed our books for 2015. We had a projected deficit of \$15,000. We were not able to pay the full portion of our mission shares for 2015 this resulted in a much smaller deficit of \$3954.
