Due to your efforts, we filled a U Haul full of food and had enough to assemble more than 1,280 snack bag packages for families facing "food insecurity". We also had enough snacks leftover to pull together more than 2,600 additional individually packaged snacks to replenish each school's stash for kids who are in need of snack at school. This is absolutely unbelievable and we could not have done this without your support and your efforts.
