Pastoral Note

"For the message of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved, it is the power of God. (1 Corinthians 1:18 (NIV).

As we enter the second month of this year, I keep reflecting on human's foolishness. Especially, these past years when we listened, took on, and lived lies as we expressed our opinions as facts that caused great harm to ourselves and to others. Yes, opinions are great while they last but are they facts or just foolishness?

Well, after living many years in and through human conditions, I always wonder if opinions are top level foolishness or willful ignorance. But the reality is whatever opinions are, they can cause harm to ourselves, families, churches, communities, nations, and the world. And when we claimed that we love God and follow Jesus Christ examples but our thoughts, words, and deeds are still like the foolish, what are we?

I do not know, what but I do know, is that there is a God who is always present and gives us opportunities for knowledge, mutual respect, to be courageous and to face and overcome challenges.

One such challenge was nicely quoted:

"Our world is not divided by race, color, gender, or religion. Our world is divided into wise people and fools. And fools divide themselves by race, color, gender, or religion." - Unknown

Hence, the simple and sometimes difficult question is," Who are we with, the wise or the fools?" It is for each of us to reflect on and answer as we live in a world that makes us choose to be wise or to be fools.

Finally as United Methodists, a part of the universal church, be reminded that in one of John Wesley's notes on Romans, he wrote about righteous living for humanity to avoid *'all unnecessary''* with those persons who cause divisions (Notes, 16:17). Therefore, let us avoid evil embedded in foolishness because it injures and causes harm to individuals, families, communities, churches, and the world. But if the truth is ever told and heard, willful ignorance, misinformation of facts and false accusations can cause lasting sufferings and destructions.

Do no harm and remain under the power of God and not the foolishness of the world!

Evangelism

My command is this: Love each other as I have loved you.

—John 15:12

It's cold and the daylight hours seem short—maybe because the hours are short! Many of us are feeling isolated in this time of masking when we go out or when we don't go out, but rather stay in. How, then, can we **love** each other as the Lord has commanded?

Here are four easy ways:

1. *Reach out* to someone else. Whether by text, email, or handwritten card, choose a person today and send them a line or two of encouragement. An "I'm thinking of you" or "we're praying for you" can mean more than you think.

2. Pick up the phone and *give someone a call*. We have many folks attending worship remotely, and we miss the chance to greet them in person. Wouldn't it be wonderful to hear their voice and for them to be surprised and warmed by your loving call?

3. Next time you pop into the corner shop or supermarket, keep an eye out for someone who is struggling with shopping bags and *offer to help* this person to their car or taxi. Taking just a few minutes out of our busy days and helping with a task we take for granted can often be such a great help to others.

4. Take two pieces of paper. On the first, write a thank you letter to God. Think about the death and

resurrection of Christ. What did Jesus go through for you? What hope does his resurrection bring you for the situations you face today?

Take the second piece of paper and *write a thank you note to someone* in your life. It might be someone who is near you physically, or someone you haven't seen for a while. Say what's in your heart when you think of this person. They'll be thanking you for many, many days.

Finally, keep praying for each other. We follow the Lord's commandment by putting *our love into action.*



Finance

Good tidings as we closed 2021 and begin 2022. We are blessed with increased December giving, and we are ending the year with a small SURPLUS, versus our original budgeted plan of a deficit of \$23,000! We are blessed many times over.

Major giving support came in to us in the last two weeks:

1. Pledged giving was \$22,111 in December, to bring us to virtually 100% of our Pledged Budget, after being behind 9% in November.

2. Other giving from inside and outside of the congregation exceeded our historical projections by almost \$13,000, surpassing any recent year's blessings.

On the expense side, Mission Shares were paid 100%, totaling \$32,000, as apportioned by our Conference. Other expenses were \$9,300 below Budget, due primarily to Covid-reduced activities by the Committees and Commissions, no Nursery Care, and lower spending before we found our new Admin. Assistant. We end the year with \$41,000 in cash, virtually the same as 2020.

Family Promise Metrowest is grateful for the recent donation from the United Methodist Women of Fisk Memorial as our organization relies on the support of congregations like yours to help vulnerable families throughout the region. Through our LIFE program families facing eviction are diverted from entering shelter and thereby avoid the trauma of homelessness. Those who already are experiencing homelessness receive services through our Shelter program. In the past, your congregation opened its doors and turned your classrooms into bedrooms, where our families would stay overnight for several weeks throughout the year. That model is changing, however, and in a few months renovations to our Day Center in Natick will be completed allowing families to stay in one place until they secure permanent housing. It's a big change for us. But one thing will remain the same: the support from congregations like yours that help us keep pace with the increasing demand for our services. We are so very grateful.
