<u>Reflections from Pastor Rick</u>

To understand John Wesley, the founder of the Methodist movement and his most important contribution to living as a Christian, we must understand grace. What is grace? Well most simply put it is the undeserved and unexpected love of God breaking into our lives and opening us to its transforming power. That may sound a bit heavy, but in practice it is when we notice the wonders that surround us and know that they are a gift. Grace comes in many forms. Grace came to John Wesley when he was sure that he was a failure and in the midst of his despair, he suddenly felt the warmth of God's embrace and knew that he was not alone. Grace may come when we look at the beauty of nature, hold the hand of a little child, look into the eyes of a loved one, or face adversity with dignity and confidence.

God's grace is all around us. We don't have to plead for it or earn it, we simply must be open to it. In my ministry I have encountered grace in places that I did not expect and each time grace appeared before

me, it came through the loving actions of someone near to me. I have written a short workbook that I have entitled "Responding to God's Grace". Through this book and the small group work that it encourages I hope you learn to open yourself to the many ways grace touches you. My dream is to engage all of you in this journey.



In order to make the largest impact on you and the life of the spirit at Fisk, we need 8 to 10 captains who will recruit folks (neighbors, friends, church folks or not) to spend six weeks in January and February reading, praying, and talking about grace as it comes into your life. We have already recruited several captains. We need a couple more. Are you game?? Call me and I will explain how it works and how powerful it can be. Even if you can't be a captain, I know that you will want to be part of one of the groups. More later.





New Year's Resolutions

As you make plans for the New Year and attempt to do some things differently...add recycling to your list! Fisk offers you many options to recycle and help others at the same time. A win - win !

Did you know Fisk:

 Collects aluminum beverage cans and plastic redeemable bottles? There is a barrel in the closet (near the Men's Room) marked Bottles and Cans. The funds from redeeming these goes to the Youth Program.

 Before you toss your aluminum cans in the barrel bend off the <u>pull tabs</u> and put them in the container in the kitchen...they go to the Shriner's Burn Hospital for equipment etc.



 Also in the kitchen is a container for <u>Labels for</u> <u>Education—from Campbell Soups</u> and many other products. These go to Cooper Community Center for recreational and educational supplies.



Boxtops for Education also...helps the schools supply classrooms with extra books etc.



- 5. <u>Non-perishable foods etc.</u> for the Natick Food Pantry. (also need personal products i.e. soap, shampoo, deodorant, toothpaste etc.) They can be left in the wooden box near the office.
- <u>Clothes</u>-currently we are collecting coats...bring in any unwanted coats in good condition. In April you can begin again to bring in good, clean, serviceable clothing for the United Methodist Economic Ministry in Maine...not until April 1. ^(C)



Something new! Can you help?

Fisk has a new opportunity to welcome others into our building, be hospitable, and to do some fundraising at the same time!

The Charles River Rotary Club of Natick/Wellesley will begin meeting in our church building January 2 and we will be serving them breakfast—<u>weekly</u> on Thursday mornings. This is a new opportunity and hopefully with the help of many of you will be a lasting, successful endeavor. The Rotary Club meets at 7:30am for a breakfast and their meeting and they are generally gone by 9:00am. (There are currently about 12 members and they pay for their breakfast whether or not they are in attendance. They pay \$12.00 each per week. So the income – before expenses is \$144.00 weekly. So there is a potential to earn up to \$5000.00 annually.)

What do we need to do?

- 1. Set-up room 9 to serve 12-15 people
- 2. Provide a full breakfast in addition to having cereal, fruit, coffee and juice available.



- 3. We need to have 5 teams of 3 people to agree to do one Thursday a month. Yes, that is 15 people!
- 4. Contributions of fresh muffins, coffee cake, breads
- 5. Be at church in time to be *ready to serve at 7:30am*.
- 6. Clean-up and go about your day...all by 9:00am.
