- December pledges were 13% over budget,
- November/December giving was 7% more than last year,
- Our special appeal to increase awareness provided a very blessed \$3,400,
- Our special fund raisers were well supported, well attended, and provided much needed support.

So, let us all say thank you for a wonderful effort and commitments to giving. We do not yet have the final results, especially on the spending side of supporting our ministries. January 18 -- Jesus travels to Galilee. While there, he begins the choosing of his disciples. Peter and John are NOT the first!!! Who are?


January 25 -- Jesus announcing the good news of God's Kingdom and chooses 4 more disciples. Who else does he choose?
