

Membership in United Methodist Women Membership is open to any woman who indicates her desire to belong and to participate in the global mission of the church through United Methodist Women. As a member each woman joins forces with other women to embrace and work on the four mission emphases reflected in the PURPOSE. Though every church is to have a unit of United Methodist Women, membership in the United Methodist Church does not automatically make a woman a member. Missions

Recycling Review - 2022

Each January I remind us all of the opportunities Fisk offers to RECYCLE "with a purpose". Actually, all recycling is purposeful...caring for God's earth.

Fisk collects <u>redeemable plastic beverage bottles</u> <u>and aluminum cans</u>. There are two barrels in the Custodian closet for your donations. Keep a bag handy at home and when you are headed to Fisk...grab it and recycle it—these funds go into the General Budget.

From May 1 to October 1 we collect your **GOOD USED CLOTHING** for a United Methodist Mission



Site in Salem Maine. They have a Thrift Shop available to the underserved people of the Western Mountains of Maine. Our recycled clothes help make available affordable clothes and also is an income to keep "the lights on and

staff paid".

The <u>"pull-tabs" or "pop-tops"</u> from beverage cans are recycled as pure aluminum for the Shriners Hospital for Children in Boston. This has been an ongoing program since 1989 and the money generated goes toward programs that <u>directly benefit children</u>. Since its inception, about a half-million pounds of aluminum tabs have been collected and recycled.

Did you know: The tabs are the only pure aluminum part of the can, and the cans may still be returned for deposit even after the tabs are removed.

Here are just some of the items that the Shriners Hospital has purchased over the years:

- **A Baxter Infusion Pump**, used to dispense pain medication.
- **Bullard Laryngoscope** used by an anesthesiologist to place a breathing tube in a patient who has a complex airway.
- **A 10-foot trailer** for the hospital van, used to transport medical equipment and records to

- outreach clinics throughout New England and New York State.
- Computerized Pressure Mapping, a force sensing array used in evaluating pressure distribution for patients requiring customized wheelchair seating systems.
- Art supplies and iPads for the children
- Replace board games / televisions

Collect can tabs all year from family, friends, neighbors, and work. Put a container in a visible place. Collecting can tabs is easy. Getting people to remember to save their tabs can be challenging.

Where to collect? Your home, work, classroom, campground, work place, assisted living or apartment buildings, container in a convenience store, near a swimming pool, clubs, sporting events etc. Put out a container with instructions to just "drop their tabs here!" We found that plastic baggies or plastic bowls work well. If you are collecting tabs in a high traffic area, then possibly even a pail would work well. Let one of the Missions Committee know and we can pick up a container from you or when you are coming to Fisk bring them in the kitchen.



NOW...something new! We are promoting a paper recycling within the building. Goal is to have BOTH a recycling wastebasket (blue) and a regular trashbasket in most rooms. PLEASE do as you are doing at home...if it is "clean paper" (no food that can't be rinsed off) it is clean. Let's see if we can do a better job at making this happen. Just sort and use the proper container.

You might think this is not NEW at Fisk, but actually we have not been very diligent stewards of this project...so the goal is to have this actually happen with great success. We need your help!
