UMCOR Hygiene Kits

These kits are an ongoing project for Fisk. The kits are in great need by UMCOR. Our goal for each year is to send 50-100 kits to UMCOR. We have sent the ones that have been collecting in Ogle Parlor—35 went on their way to a depot and will be used as needed throughout the world. This is something that is so easy and <u>so needed</u>. Put this list in your wallet and when you see one of the



items...buy 2 or even 6. There is a basket in the parlor for your donations. Someone this past year bought 50 pairs of nail clippers—thanks, that is so helpful. Be creative, BUT you must follow the list

exactly.

<u>Hand towel</u> 15"x25" or 17"x27", no microfiber
<u>Facecloth</u> no microfiber
<u>Soap</u> 3oz. or larger Bath bar soap, wrapped No lvory or Jergens
<u>Comb</u> Sturdy and with at least 6" of teeth
<u>Toothbrush</u> Adult size and individually packaged
<u>Nail clippers</u> Nail or toenail clippers
<u>10 common adhesive bandages</u> "band aids" 3 x ¾ "
Package all in a one-gallon re-sealable plastic bag.

CLOTHES FOR MAINE

The United Methodist Economic Ministry in Salem Maine supplies two thrift shops through our connectional church system. This Mission Site serves many, many families in this under-served area of the western mountains of Maine. Their revenue is dependent on us, from our pledges, our giving, and our clothes that they sell for very reasonable prices. Many residents in the area shop here, regardless of their income level.

NOW ... about the clothes: It is best if they are folded into paper grocery bags; they are much easier to move around and get to their destination. They take clothes for all seasons, all ages, and all genders. Infants and children's clothing are always appreciated and needed. Where to bring them? Two options... Drop them at Hoyt's home-8 Bacon St. If we are not home, just put them "on the porch by the side door". There is a bench there so they will not get wet.

It is also good stewardship of our building and the outside space.

There have been so many successes: Dr. Belinda Forbes, our connection with the General Board of Global Ministries, your support of Cooper Community Center, you are regular volunteers at the Natick Food Pantry, our continued support of JFON and United Methodist Economic Ministry in Maine, to name just a few. Since that time so many things have been started, and fortunately continued for us to serve God and..."clothe the naked, feed the hungry and welcome the stranger" (Matt. 25-paraphrased.) My involvement with UMW has also kept me inspired to do this work.

Thank you for your support and for your efforts in these and the many others way to act on our beliefs. Our work is not done! John Wesley challenges us to...


Simon Peter: Flawed but Faithful Disciple

Be Bold: Finding Your Fierce




The Authenticity Challenge: 21 Days to a More Content Life
