Today is Ash Wednesday, the beginning of the season of Lent, for me the most fruitful season of the year.

One of my annual Lenten traditions is to read T. S. Eliot's poem, Ash Wednesday. Like most of Eliot's work, it is a complicated piece and more than a little abstract. A few of the lines, however, are clear and particularly thought-provoking:



Blessèd sister, holy mother, spirit of the fountain, spirit of the garden, Suffer us not to mock ourselves with falsehood Teach us to care and not to care Teach us to sit still Even among these rocks, Our peace in His will And ever among these rocks Sister, mother And spirit of the river, spirit of the sea, Suffer me not to be separated

Difficult reading, perhaps. Yet the poem speaks precisely (and beautifully) to the experience of disciples eager

And let my cry come unto Thee.

to follow the Master into the wilderness of Lent, where: We encounter the One who says,

"Be still, and know that I am God".

we reflect upon the meaning and purpose of our lives; we find forgiveness of our sin and the renewal of our spirits; we are strengthened for the time of trial - and made empty in order to be filled with the glory of Resurrection

To some, outside the Body, all of that might sound like a lot of difficult, even tiresome work. To me - to us - it is an invitation to peace, happiness, joy and hope, our invitation to walk the pilgrim path with the Lord Jesus, Himself. We believe and trust that Easter is coming. Let us also trust that the pathway to Easter is the wilderness season of Lent. Christ is calling. Won't you follow?

We prayed, we read from the Bible, ...and we took the initial steps to re-evaluate our mission and role, while identifying what we do well (or not so well). We articulated why we belong to and attend Fisk, looked at how people have and might find us, and discussed what programs we have (or could have) to bring people to Jesus Christ and to Fisk.

The meeting notes have been organized and typed, and are available to everyone. Our next steps will be to review and prioritize goals, and then to develop action plans and activities to help achieve those goals.

We would like to hear from everyone that loves Fisk Church. We know that each person has unique and valuable input, and that the church (<u>our Church</u>) is made up of many parts that can work together, ...to set the course for the "Look and Feel" of Fisk in the coming years.

### Youth Mission Trip New Jersey 2012 U.M. ARMY

June 24-30, 2012

Members of the *Methodist Youth Fellowship (MYF)* and adults from Fisk Memorial United Methodist Church in Natick, MA will spend one week in June in New Jersey performing community outreach services. Tasks in the *United Methodist Action Reach-out Mission by Youth (U. M. Army)* program includes painting, cleaning, building/assembly of handicapped ramps and repairing homes of the underprivileged and handicapped of this New Jersey community. Our youth will interact with other youth from churches in Connecticut, Vermont, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Maine and Massachusetts. In addition to the community work, U.M. Army participants will also engage in daily worship and spiritual growth activities.

What is the United Methodist Action Reach-out Mission by Youth? United Methodist Action Reach-out Mission by Youth (U.M. ARMY) is an opportunity for youth and adults to experience Christian growth through service to others. Participants combine their strengths to meet home repair and maintenance needs for those unable to pay for the work, or who cannot do the work for themselves. One of their founding principles is that real and life changing mission work can take place close to home. They are committed to putting their resources to work in local communities.



#### Fisk 2012 Financial Budget

In 2012, we face significant financial challenges as a congregation. The initial deficit gap was significant, but we have worked together with the Trustees to utilize the full resources of the congregation. We have reduced some expenses by asking the Trustees to assume the facility maintenance and other costs in 2012, and level funded or reduced other expenses. This cooperation was essential and significant, and we have reduced the Budget deficit to \$3,900 for the year. This deficit is due to our continuing trends in the last few years of loss of membership, absence of meaningful growth, a reduced pledge base, and the critical need for continued funding of our essential ministries and support.

We were blessed in 2011 with a prayerful and generous response to our 2011 financial needs. Increased support in December reduced our large projected deficit to only \$1,124. However, after carefully utilizing our cash savings from prior years to maintain the vital ministries our church, we were forced into the very undesirable position of not fully paying our New England Conference Mission shares, the support which all churches provide to the Conference. We made that decision prayerfully and carefully, and reserved the possibility of paying those mission obligations in July of 2012 if our financial position has improved.

The ministries of Fisk touch so many people in so many ways. Those ministries, as always, depend upon the financial support of each and every one of us. As a congregation, we have responded in the past, and with prayer, cooperation, intentional dedication to growing our church, and HIS grace, we will respond and succeed in 2012.
