Pastor's Message

The season of Lent began with Ash Wednesday which was February 22. We are grateful for the start of this journey with all our siblings. As we start, let us be very intentional in walking in the footstep of Jesus Christ. And as we travel, it is important for each of us to remain in community, stay connected, and make a commitment to the ministry and mission of Jesus Christ, at Fisk UMC.

What is Lent and why does it last forty days?

Lent is a season of forty days, not counting Sundays, which begins on Ash Wednesday and ends on Holy Saturday. Lent comes from the Anglo Saxon word lencten, which means "spring". The forty days represents the time Jesus spent in the wilderness, enduring the temptation of Satan and preparing to begin his ministry.

Lent is a time of repentance, fasting, and preparation for the coming of Easter. It is a time of self-examination and reflection. In the early church, Lent was a time to prepare new converts for baptism. Today, Christians focus on their relationship with God, often choosing to give up something or to volunteer and give of themselves for others.

Sundays in Lent are not counted in the forty days because each Sunday represents a "mini-Easter" and the reverent spirit of Lent is tempered with joyful anticipation of the Resurrection. Continue to live with hope.



HEALTH / HYGIENE KITS

Our annual goal is 100 Kits!

Can we do it again in 2023?

These are used by UMCOR to help in the many situations where they go in to help restablish homes and families following disasters, tornados, floods etc.

When you are out shopping...pick up one or more of these 7 items. Soon you will have all 7 requested items...but do follow the list very closely. Items must be consistent and as described. Leave items or kits in the tall basket in Ogle Parlor.

Hygiene Kit Materials

- One hand towel (15 x 25 –17 x 27 inches)
 No kitchen, cleaning, or microfiber towels
- One washcloth <u>No</u> kitchen, cleaning, or <u>microfiber</u> towels
- One comb
 Must be sturdy with at least <u>6 inches</u> of teeth

No pocket combs or picks

- One toenail or fingernail <u>clipper</u>
 No emery boards or metal nail files
- Bath-size soap (3 oz. bar or larger)
 No Ivory or Jergen's soap
 Do not remove from packaging
- One adult toothbrush individually packaged
- 10 adhesive bandages (¾ by 3 inches)
 Common household bandages acceptable
- · One one-gallon size re-sealable bag

Assembly Directions

- Lay hand towel flat on a table.
- Lay the washcloth in the center of the hand towel.
- Place all remaining items on top of the washcloth (except the plastic bag).
- Fold the sides of the hand towel to cover the items.
- Grasp the bundle tightly and roll over the remainder of the towel.
- Place the tightly rolled bundle in the plastic bag, remove air, and seal.

Earthquakes-Turkey and Syria

A 7.8 magnitude earthquake struck southern Turkey at 4:17 a.m. on Monday, Feb. 6, 2023, the most powerful earthquake recorded since 1939. In the hours that followed, at least 78 aftershocks were reported, followed by a second earthquake of 7.5 magnitude. Tens of thousands of people have been killed, and responders are still recovering victims.

The earthquake also heavily impacted northwest Syria, where 4.1 million people depend on humanitarian assistance. The majority are women and children. At this time, Syrian communities are simultaneously facing an ongoing cholera outbreak and extreme winter weather events, including heavy rain and snow. The humanitarian response is overstretched due to the devastation and cold weather.

UMCOR has released initial solidarity grants to longstanding partner, International Blue Crescent (IBC) and Forum for Development Culture and Dialogue (working in Syria) to help provide tents, heaters, blankets, warm clothes, ready to eat meals and first aid kits to those who have been displaced. IBC has offices in Turkey.

It seems Hygiene Kits are in use in Turkey, Syria and Ukraine as people are re-settled. As we collect 100 we deliver them to the local DEPOT and they are then transported to a major UMCOR distribution center. How can you help?
