Finance Update – March 2024

The faithful support of you the congregation continues to be the foundation of our many ministries here at Fisk. We have several updates to share:


- With your generosity, our overall pledge support was strong in December, and we finished the year very close to our planned results... thank you!
- We paid 100% of our conference Mission Shares again in 2023... supporting our connectional ministries in the areas of pastoral support, New England missions, and international missions,
- Our 2024 Stewardship campaign was a success, providing the continuing foundation for our 2024 ministries,
- Our 2024 expenses are impacted by a major insurance increase due to economic and environmental impacts, but we received support from our Conference leadership, including the Bishop, and received approval for their Mission Share relief program.
- Our 2024 Budget Plan has been prepared by leadership, reviewed and recommended by Finance, and just approved by the Administrative Board for 2024.

Our challenges are significant, but our support from you the congregation is inspiring, and we continue to provide the important ministries of Fisk. Every contribution matters.
