Reflections from Pastor Mark



One of the perks of my office at Fisk is that it comes with a restroom. (Not meaning to be indelicate – but if you've happened to have one cup too many of coffee in the morning, a nearby facility beats a stroll to the other side of the building any day!)

What this restroom lacks is the poster which hung in the restroom of another pastor's office in which I worked. Don't have any idea where the poster has gotten to, but I rather

miss it: A big yellow-printed rectangle upon which is printed the photograph of a little yellow chick standing in front of a broken egg. Adorable (not a word I often use). Below the picture are these words:

Now what do I do?

I often looked at that poster and wondered the same thing. Followers of Christ – from first to last – are driven to ask this question following the resurrection of the Lord. Perhaps it was actually easier for the first disciples: Caught up in the excitement (and astonishment) of Jesus' rising, they were instructed by the Lord to wait in Jerusalem for the coming of the Holy Spirit. They obeyed the command and on the day of Pentecost, Jesus' words were again proved true: The Holy Spirit anointed the believers with power and understanding. The Church, Christ's body, a community unlike any other, was born.

The early Church lived by the inspired guidance of the apostles and its life was marked by prayer, fellowship, communal sharing of property and wealth, and explosive growth. It was a dangerous and exciting time, and one thing is certainly clear: Many of Christ's followers were so full of the Spirit that they gave

themselves over entirely to the new thing God was doing, namely, transforming a world of deep darkness by the light of divine, death-defying love.

Christ has been risen for us, too. And something is required of us in return – not payment, of course (how could we ever pay for God's love for us?) – but a loving response to God's redeeming love. God desires, requires – if we will accept the honor – that our lives become the Good News. This, exactly, is the answer to our question: Now what do we do? We are to become Christ's body for the world – loving, forgiving, reconciling, inviting our neighbor into God's glorious kingdom.

In response to Easter and anticipating Pentecost, consider:

➤ Where do I see the Holy Spirit moving at Fisk Church?
➤ How am I the Good News of God's redeeming love?
