At our 10:30am service we had a great crowd with many children. Someone said to me, "This is how Fisk used to be!" My reply is, "This is how Fisk is going to be!"

This church has so much to offer its members, the community, and the world. We simply need to put it all together and get the word out. Easter Egg Hunt follow-up!

In 2013, a group of Fisk members started planning to host a community wide Easter egg hunt as part of the church growth initiative, and we had no idea what kind of attendance to expect. God knew and thankfully He directed us in our planning such that not a single one of the more than 177 children went home without eggs or crafts! This year we lowered the age attendance from 1-10 year olds to 1-8 year olds, and we still had **174** registered children plus their parents and grandparents visit our church, even with the lowered age limit! And, we saw some of the faces on Sunday morning at Easter Services as well! What a blessing!

We made quite a few process improvements this year including an improved throughput, entering through the sanctuary doors where they were greeted by Debi Henry and Crystal Mayo among others and at the end, exiting out the Whipple set of doors where Eva and her adorable puppy, a real hit with the children, made sure that each child left with their goodie bag. After registering, Zach Gates and others helped usher small groups into our beautiful Sanctuary where Dorothy Philips and Pastor Rick welcomed them to our church. Barb Beekman and Betsy Hoyt and others then usher them outside to the Easter Egg hunt areas, segmented by age groups for crowd control and safety or to rooms 8&9 for the toddler room manned by Debbie Friscino and Susan Carney and her daughter made sure even our youngest attendees had a great time. Josh, well, Josh did just about every job that needed assistance – we will just say on our team, he was the designated hitter and the closing pitcher!

After the hunt, the children came in to Whipple Hall and had the opportunity to color an Easter scene or work an Easter cross word puzzle or connect the dots as well as have snacks and to choose a craft such as a paper plate chicken, egg necklace or a bunny pencil. Many thanks to Pat Price, Tian Zhang, Michelle Drolet and Marcia Hoyt and others who manned the craft tables.

We had a full court press on promoting the event which, combined with the great word-of-mouth marketing done by our members, contributed to the excellent attendance. Fliers were distributed to Starbucks in Sherwood Plaza, several day care centers including FACE, Natick Hall, and Morse Library. Marcia Hoyt addressed postcards for a neighborhood mailing which was very successful. Sherry Culver broadly publicized the event online on multiple community bulletin boards and on our own beautiful Fisk website. And, Debi Henry sent her "feet team" out delivering fliers all over Natick and Framingham which drove in a great many people, as did the placards in front of the church which Susan Carney's compelling copy.

There are so many people in the church that need to be thanked but are too numerous to list them all, but each of you deserve a big Christian hug for making this such a successful initiative and what we hope will be the start of a new tradition here at Fisk. Marcia Hoyt and Deborah Hernandez drove the planning and execution but without so many of you who hid eggs, registered families, assembled crafts, brought in food, filled goodie bags, etc., it would not have happened. Marcia and her granddaughter Molly deserve an additional shout out for filling over 1,500 eggs!

And, it doesn't stop there. While we had a few repeats, most were new attendees and many parents asked about Sunday School for their children. We now have names and addresses to use for future mailings and will be looking forward to more events to create wonderful experiences for our community children and to give us an opportunity to share the warmth of Fisk and Christian love with all who participate.

We hope that each of you will put on your creative hats and be thinking about how we can better serve the children of our community, most of whom have no church home.


