As the Sunday School Superintendent and cheerleader of all children, I feel compelled to write this article. Please read it knowing that I take very seriously the words that Jesus said, "Let the children come unto me."

Let me start with the nursery. The nursery has been set up for children age 5 and under. There are some circumstances when older children have been allowed to stay in the nursery during church. I would ask that when these circumstances affect you that you speak to me or those in the nursery to seek an answer. This will help us to ensure the safety and fun for our youngest members. Thank you!

That being said in church behavior does not happen overnight. We must foster it, expect it, and acknowledge it. Here are some tips that I have seen working for some of you ----

I am hoping that these ideas will make church more meaningful for our children.

1. When entering the church remind your child that they are here to worship God.

- 2. Grab a book or a clipboard with age appropriate activities.
- 3. Once you are in the pew have your children acknowledge others around them. This may let them know that they are part of the church community and not just attending to get through it.
- 4. Open the bulletin and point things out to themeven if they cannot read They can be read to.
- Pick a place in the service that is reasonable for your child to look at the book or clipboard. Knowing all of our kids --- I would say that no one should need them until after the Children's Sermon.
- 6. Have them stand when the congregation stands .
- 7. They should all be attempting the Doxology and the Lord's Prayer.
- 8. You should feel free to talk to point out things in the Bible and Hymnal and around the church.
- 9. Keep pushing the point where they have permission to use the clipboard papers
- 10. When asking them to be quietput your finger to your mouth or have a sign instead of engaging in shhhhh or words. That opens the talking gate.
- 11. On the way home discuss what they heard in church. If they heard one word ...it is a start.
- 12. Ask God to help you to know your child and their needs and how to react to them.
- 13. Know that I pray for our children all the time and want church to be a community worship time for them.
- 14. If you have suggestions for me that would help you and others please let me know.






