Easter Sunday may have come and gone but the Easter season is still with us during the month of May. We will uplift three days in May: <u>Ascension, Pentecost Sunday,</u> and Trinity Sunday.

Ascension (Thursday, May 10): 40 days after Easter Sunday. While much of the world may see Ascension Day as just another Thursday, United Methodists can celebrate. With John and Charles Wesley, we remember that Jesus ascended to heaven where he took his rightful throne as Lord of the whole earth. (umc.org)

Pentecost (May 20): 50 days after Easter Sunday, Pentecost is the day on which the Christian church commemorates the coming of the Holy Spirit upon the apostles and others assembled in Jerusalem. It marks the beginning of the Christian church throughout the world and is often referred to as the birthday of the church. (umc.org)

<u>Trinity Sunday (May 27)</u>: Trinity Sunday occurs on the Sunday following Pentecost and celebrates the Christian doctrine of the three Persons of God: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

In addition, Fisk UMC will be celebrating <u>two baptisms</u> on May 13.

Tidings from the Trustees

It's finally Spring, and the Trustees and many of you have been working diligently to get God's house in order. Below is a quick update on recent and upcoming activities to maintain our facilities:

• Spring Cleaning: **Thank you** to the 25 people, ages 4 to over 84, who helped clean the church for Easter. What a blessing to see so many of you!

- Roof: We have received bids and accepted one to replace the roof extending from the nursery to the intersection with the sanctuary. Please note that we will likely need to do more roof repairs or replacement in the very near future due to the age of the roof. Please don't hesitate to let the Trustees know if you see another leak. We are aware of multiple leaks in the sanctuary. Many thanks to David Cail and Geoff Del Sesto who have worked with contractors to get us the highest quality at the best price for our roofing needs.
- Exterior doors: The double doors outside the choir room off the front of the sanctuary have suffered as we all have under the toll of New England weather the last few years. As with the roof, bids were obtained, and a contractor will be replacing those doors over the next few weeks.
- Heating: The Trustees also voted to improve the heat flow to rooms 5, 6 and 7 used by FACE. We also improved the heat flow last month to the nursery and the children's Sunday School rooms. Now some of God's smallest children (and their blessed teachers) will be cozier!
- Gardening: Please let Deborah Hernandez or Geoff Del Sesto know if you are interested in helping to maintain the grounds, particularly our lovely garden. Even a few minutes to bend and pull a weed would be appreciated. And, if getting down on bended knee is a problem, we have a few standing projects as well! Also, if you have cuttings or bulbs from your yard or garden that you could share, we would welcome them to the garden or greater campus as we do need to replant quite a few areas.
- Directed gifts: Just a reminder, that you are welcome to directly give of your financial gifts to your preferred project or the general maintenance fund to help maintain or update our facilities. Please see one of the Trustees if you would like a list of projects that are planned or are on our wish list for your consideration.
- Maintenance needs: Please let any of the Trustees or Pastor know if you see anything around the church that needs some extra love. We frequently walk through with our tool belts on and notebooks in hand, but we need your help to keep God's house in optimal condition.

United Methodist Economic Ministry

You have heard the church talk about UMEM. It is one



of our connectional mission sites in New England. This is a mission agency serving the underserved people of the Western Mountains of Maine. Fisk has been delivering good,

used clothing and small household items to Salem Maine for many years.

Currently, they have three Thrift Shops, all supplied through the Salem site. They also have a Food Cupboard and some housing services as well as being a warm, caring place for those alone. They host a Pot Luck supper for the area each Wednesday during July and August. The staff are often the only contact a person may have during the day or for days. It is the "store" for the area. Anyone can shop there.

Leave your good, clean used clothing in the wooden box in the hallway or call Gary or Marcia Hoyt to leave them at their house. We really appreciate when they are

folded into paper grocery bags. It is much easier to handle then large heavy plastic bags.
