JFON - Justice for Our Neighbors OUR MISSION DOLLARS AT WORK!

Although NE-JFON does occasionally send **teams of attorneys to the U.S.**—**Mexico border**, most of our work with asylum seekers happens right here in the United States. There are hundreds of asylumseeking families living in our cities, towns, and communities who need our help.

The United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR) has just announced a three-year, \$1.8 million pilot project to support asylum seekers in the U.S.

Church World Service, meanwhile, will help the asylum seekers with their day-to-day practical needs; housing, registering children for school, enrolling in language classes, and accessing various social service



and community programs. We thank Amy B. for her volunteer work in Framingham teaching English as a second language.


Congratulations
