A Word From Pastor Xia

Dear Fisk church family and friends,

Greetings in the name of Jesus Christ our Lord! It is hard to believe that I have been working with you for three months. Time just flew by. I am so grateful for this church family that has been supporting me in many ways. As I continue to lead worship and preach, visit parishioners, provide pastoral care and counseling, facilitate daily devotional and prayer moments, as well as meet with leaders and ministry teams to plan on the ministry for the rest of 2014 and the next year, I begin to put myself in the context of Fisk and its wider community, do theological reflections on some of the "daily routines" that I see as sacred calling and how these "old" spiritual practices speak new things to me in a new church and community setting, and how all of you, the saints of the Fisk church have enhanced and reshaped my understanding of ministry.

This early morning I was reading daily devotional, and praying for people on my prayer list. On the list there were some I have visited and chatted with, and some I didn't yet have a chance to visit—but in my prayer every day. What is the meaning of pastoral visit? I asked myself. Am I just showing people that I am nice? Or because it makes me feel good, being a caring pastor and responsible disciple of Christ? If it is not the case, or at least it is much more than that, what is the meaning of pastoral visit and prayer to me?

Every time I read the Bible, what deeply touched my heart is Jesus' presence in people's day-to-day life as a dear friend, brother, redeemer, counselor, healer, comforter and the Son of God who brings peace, hope and unconditional love. He speaks to our real situations and circumstances. To me, Jesus is a good teacher and role model. What a wonderful thing it is to encounter God in sacraments, prayers, Scripture reading, ministry AND

DAILY LIFE! Through visits and casual conversations with people, I know them not just by names. People teach me how to think in a different way, not simply based on my own experiences and understandings, but from people's unique context and spiritual needs; how to be present to God's beloved, and how to find new ways to work together, support and encourage one another in Christ, be united in love and the One Spirit and One body. For me, it is not a one-way road of learning, but a spiritual journey together. Isn't this togetherness/oneness a wonderful present and grace from God? I always enjoy being in prayer and ministry with people, and say "thank you" to God for this amazing grace.

I journey with you, and I am so grateful for this privilege. From a personal perspective, all this has shaped who I am, how I do ministry, how I care for others and for myself, and how I understand God's grace at work. I am so grateful that all saints here at Fisk church so kindly let me be myself, and walk the journey together with support and prayer. May we continue to work together in love and trust, and faithfully follow the Holy One to build up the church and reach out to the wider community and the world.

May God's grace and peace be with you and your loved ones.





\$\$ Finance Update – October 2014

The fall season is a beautiful reminder of

God's many gifts to us, and our obligation as good stewards to give back a portion of that bounty. Financially, we continue to find ourselves behind our Plan after eight months. The faithful support of you, the congregation, continues to be a blessing, but the summer months of vacations and family times have slowed the giving which is vital to our ministries. As a result we are spending wisely, and carefully managing our resources:

- Your financial support is 11% below Budget, through mid-September
- We are spending less than our budgeted expenses to compensate, saving 10% so far, but expenses continue,
- We continue to pray for improvements in our financial position.

We would urge you to review your Statement of Giving which you will receive in mid-October, and make every effort to catch up on your commitment to Fisk's ministries. If you have not given in the past, we would urge you to consider supporting our ministries. Our Plan still requires us to "borrow" from our resources in order to fund all of our planned ministries in 2014.

The ministries of Fisk touch so many people in so many ways. As we enter the fall, we must prayerfully and purposefully work to grow our church spiritually...and our finances will follow.
