

Natick Days 2017

All we can say is wow! The Fisk Prayer Wall was even better received than last year! The wall was set up with some of the prayers from last year, on ivory colored tags. Susan Carney brought white prayer tags for the 2017 Natick Days prayers so that all could see that the Prayer Wall is an on-going Fisk ministry, and it worked! Look at all the white tags! While Pat Price tied knots in the tags to be hung, many Fisk Evangelists stood around the

Prayer Wall and asked people, as they walked by, if they needed a prayer for themselves, for someone they loved, or just something they were grateful for. It was the weekend when Hurricane IRMA was hitting hard, so many prayers were for those in harm's way.

As with last year there were special moments throughout the day. Here are a few:

- 1. I asked a woman walking by if she would like to put a prayer on the wall. She stopped and gave me an emphatic "YES". We went to put her prayer on the wall saying "Lord hear our prayer." She looked at me and shared that she had been diagnosed with Stage 4 Breast Cancer which had moved to her liver, and she had 2 little kiddo's at home. The woman said she had been in remission for a while, but the likelihood of it returning was really high. So let's continue to pray for her.
- 2. Three Young Men walked by and I asked if they would like to put a prayer on the wall? The first two were kind of like "What is it?", but the third, you could see, really got it. His eyes lit up and he said "Yes!" A few minutes later, as they were writing their prayers, I said to him "You really get this" and "you must have a great family." After they put their prayers on the wall he walked up to a woman who I thought must be his mother; I went over and shared with her what had just transpired and how inspired I was by her son. He came over and shared that he had just started his Freshman Year at Natick High and he was having a real hard time (his girlfriend had broken up with him the week before) and he was using prayers to help him get through it. I handed him a white prayer bear which he really appreciated! I told him to put it in his mother's purse and know our Fisk Family is praying with and for him. It was a WOW moment.
- 3. One more....A mother put a prayer on the wall for her daughter who had just left for college and had had rough Jr. and Sr. years in High School. We exchanged a few words and I said I would pray for hers if she would pray for mine. We shared a tear.

It was an emotional day but wonderful. We thank everyone who helped with the gathering of information, coloring materials, setup, working during the event and clean up! We have an amazing team and we should all be so proud. God was with us and is with us always. Blessed to be a blessing.
