#### Pastoral Note

Recently, I restarted the monthly worship service at Whitney Place in Natick. Though they were closed for over eighteen months, I felt blessed to be there with those who came to worship. It was a blessing to see residents and enjoy the experience together. Most of all, to hear that those who worship were still connected to each other, and remembered that God was still present as Pastor Alecia was praying for them.

When I was leaving, I sat in my car for a while to reflect on this re-entry experience and what I had heard. As I did, I realized that our United Methodist's theological tradition of evangelism is not simply a ministry for a few. Everyone, who is a child of God, has the responsibility to reach out and minister to others. That is, anyone who believes in God's Grace, is willing to follow Jesus Christ and live by spreading social holiness. And though I was not present with them, the past year, they took the responsibility that they are sent to spread the good news. Older and frail, they also believe that our God is a "Sending God" and they, in turn, are a part of the people sent out.

In our United Methodist theological tradition, God sends all people as evangelists. But that alone is not enough because a lifelong process of nurture and persistence is also a necessity. The task belongs to the whole people of God in and out of the church. In view of this, it is my prayer that each of us at Fisk UMC continue to understand that God calls each person to some form of ministry. Therefore, we are counting on each one to be a part of some ministry and/or mission.

Yes! We need your tithe, talent, and time. We need your prayers, presence, and participation. But we also need you to share God's grace. Grace that is undeserved, unmerited, and FREE. With this available for everyone, I pray that we continue to believe that everyone can be reached. As we continue to reach out, know that grace works to restore and/or establish a person's relationship with God even when we are not present. Those sisters and brothers in Christ at Whitney Place are still reaching out to others even as they are getting older and frail. How about us?

#### From Afghanistan to the United States

What can we do? How to help!

The United Methodist Foundation of New England and New England <u>Justice for Our Neighbors</u> (NE JFON) have established a matching fund to help support our new Afghan neighbors in New England. In the wake of the U.S. withdrawal from Afghanistan tens of thousands of families were evacuated. They are men, women, and children whose lives were endangered by the new regime; many had assisted U.S. military.

Among the first evacuees and refugees here in New England will be 150-200 persons to be settled in Lowell, MA, with additional arrivals anticipated in Boston and Manchester, NH. Most of these people will arrive with nothing but the clothes on their backs.

The <u>International Institute of New England</u> (IINE) has long been used by the U.S. State Department as a primary nonprofit for the resettlement of refugees in

New England and has experienced staff to assist these new arrivals. IINE <u>relies on donors</u> to provide financial assistance.
