

They are used to stock three Thrift Shops in this area of high unemployment and under-served people.

For many years we have sold Balsam wreaths made by local families to supplement their income. Well, they are no longer participating in the Wreath-making project... BUT they now have a supplier of Maple Syrup! We had some at the Fair last November and it was very popular. This product is a home industry of a few families...earning funds for their winter heating expenses and/or taxes.



We went to UMEM last week and brought back some MAPLE SYRUP...we have plenty and it is available when you need it...for breakfast or a gift. We will have it for sale at the Fair in November, but if you would like some sooner just let me know. We have ½ pints, pints and quarts.
