Fisk collected 48 completed Health Kits for the 2016 collection at Annual Conference. Our 48 were added to those from around the New England Conference totaling 1000 kits. These are sent on to UMCOR and distributed throughout the year to those in need. Those receiving a Health Kit often have survived a flood, fire, drought, tornadoes, earthquakes or just a lack of resources. These kits are also used to teach good healthy habits to third world countries. This is an ongoing project and we will begin again to collect for 2017. Can we double that number? There are seven items in a kit...so if you just purchase one item (or multiples) each month...by next June we should have 100 kits! Information is on the Bulletin Board.


#### Beverage cans and plastic bottles




Did you know that Fisk collects and recycles these containers? They are counted, bagged and redeemed in Framingham and the income goes into the Youth Budget. The barrels are in
