#### "A Visit from Joshua Lawrence Chamberlain"

#### A First Person portrayal by Rev. Bob Macfarlane

We welcome Rev. Bob & Diana Macfarlane, life-long friends of Dave & Jan Cail. Bob is a Civil War enthusiast, and since 2013 is the 150th Anniversary of the Battle of Gettysburg, it seemed fitting to have him as our program. Bob "becomes" General Chamberlain, the leader of the 20th Maine Regiment of Little Round Top fame of July 2, 1863. He speaks as if it were 1889, the year in which he helps dedicate the Memorial with his 20th Maine boys. The program is entitled "A Visit from Joshua Lawrence Chamberlain," and he wears the uniform of the Civil War General.

Rev. Macfarlane is a Minister of the United Church of Christ, and grew up in the Youth Group of the First Congregational Church of Waltham, where he was ordained in 1971. Retired after 40 years of ministry, Bob is now serving in his third Interim Ministry position. He and Diana live in their retirement cottage in Carver.

#### UMCOR Heath Kits

Plans are being made for the Evangelism Ministry to have a booth at Natick Days on September 21, on the Natick Common. We will be inviting visitors at the booth to assemble UMCOR health kits. Over the summer, please consider helping us by purchasing a variety of items needed for the kits. There will be a labeled container in the church office for your donations. Watch for other ideas on how you may share your special gifts as the date gets closer. The members of the Evangelism Ministry thank you in advance.

Below is the list of items needed:

- 1 hand towel (15" x 25" up to 17" x 27", No kitchen towels)
- 1 washcloth
- 1 comb (large and sturdy, not pocket-sized)
- 1 nail file or fingernail clippers (no emery boards or toenail clippers)
- 1 bath-size bar of soap in wrapper (3 oz. and up)
- 1 toothbrush (single brushes only in original wrapper, no child-size brushes)
- 6 adhesive plastic strip sterile bandages
- \$1.00 to purchase toothpaste (NOTE: UMCOR Sager Brown is now purchasing toothpaste in bulk to be added to health kits before shipping to ensure that the product does not expire before they are sent).
